### Annual General Meeting

Our second Annual General Meeting (AGM) will be held on Tuesday, 30th March 2004 at our usual venue, the Mersey Pub Hotel.


All the members of FIN's executive committee are required to retire from office at the end of the AGM, but may be re-elected or re-appointed.

FIN's current executive committee is made up of 5 elected members; chairman, treasurer, secretary and 2 additional members without specific duties. At present Kath Frame is the chairman, Eric Corbett is the treasurer, Ruth Corbett is the secretary, with Bill and Ann Beck filling the other 2 positions.

Any member who wishes to stand for election to any of these positions on the executive committee should make their nominations to the secretary, either by email ([secretary@ferretsinnneed.org.uk](mailto:secretary@ferretsinnneed.org.uk)) or in writing to the secretary at 100 Derbyshire Lane, Stretford, Manchester M32 8DR, by Friday the 12th March 2004.

If nominations exceed vacancies, then election will be by ballot, in which case ballot papers will be distributed to all members to be returned either by post or at the AGM in person. Ballot papers returned by post must be received by the secretary no later than 5.00pm on Friday the 26th March 2004.

### Pet Travel Scheme



Hands up everyone who thought that, as from this summer, ferrets would be allowed to travel within Europe just as freely as cats and dogs have been able to do.

It turns out that things aren't quite that simple after all. Would you believe that the keeping of ferrets appears to be illegal in Portugal! The Portuguese government are therefore trying to negotiate some kind of exception to the rules for that country. Our north-west Member of the European Parliament, Chris Davies, intends to call for a change in the law.

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### Portugal and the Pet Travel Scheme

Although ferrets will be able to travel between European Union member countries from July onwards this year, it has come to light that it's illegal to keep ferrets in Portugal!

Chris Davies, MEP for the North West, recently raised this issue with the European Parliament, and was informed that the Portuguese government intends to issue a decree stating that there will be an additional obligation for owners of ferrets to obtain a permit from the Portuguese Environment Ministry prior to taking them into Portugal.

Well, I am not sure really how this will help anyone (can you image the problems of trying to get a

permit from the Portugese Environment Ministry from outside of Portugal?). Also, it is totally inconsistent for ferrets to be able to travel within Europe under European Law, and yet be illegal within an EU member state.

Chris intends to call for a change in the law. We'll keep you updated on his progress.
